Phones away for the day from 2024

- United approach in supporting students
- Ministerial decision to have phones away for the day
 - Phones will be required to be switched off in school bags and then locked in their locker for the duration of the day.
 - Smart watches and other devices may be worn with notifications switched off
 - Canteen will require Eftpos card or preorder online and prepaid.
 - Students are responsible for their phone during the day.
 - Exemptions can be discussed with Deputy Principals on case-by-case basis (medical, disability, wellbeing reasons)
 - All phones and wearable devices are included regardless of internet connectivity.
 - Also applies to school activities (e.g. sporting events, excursions) unless exemption made by school Principal
 - Support and resources will be distributed to parents / students.

4-day school week:

 4-day school week – consultation regarding flexible days. Often used for senior students to pick up pathways study programs etc. Media hype up based on slight policy change – nothing has really changed.
