

Attendance = achievement. Research informed data states that high attendance is one of the precursors for high achievement.

This is often measured through effort and behaviour.

PRE-REQUISITES

For students to select this pathway due to the pace and rigour of learning, students must have:

- 90% attendance or higher in Year 10,
- Achieve B's or higher in all Year 10 subjects
- Receive good or very good effort and behaviour
- Be demonstrating and committing to good learning habits, eg. meeting all deadlines
